

2026 Golf Policies

- Proper Golf Attire always – golf course and practice facilities.
- We are a Spikeless Golf Shoe Facility Only. Please see the golf shop if you have any questions.
- No Single Rider Carts are allowed unless it's necessary to complete a threesome. If you are caught using a single cart without a justified reason, you will be charged double for the cart.
- Tee times can be made a week out at 6:30am on the club's website or mobile app.
- Players must check in with the starter or golf shop staff to ensure accurate charges and record rounds of golf. If you only play 9 holes, you must notify the golf shop.
- All names must be filled in on the tee sheet.
- "No Shows" or "Filler Names" will be charged a cart fee (Weather exceptions determined by the golf staff.)
- Members can bring their own pushcarts during walking hours; however, you will be charged a pushcart fee.

Dress Code:

Clubhouse private events

Dress codes for private events are at the discretion of the event's host, but the minimum standard is "casual attire." Casual attire is defined as any attire other than crop tops, athletic tank tops, and flip-flops. Uniform of the day is considered casual attire.

Clubhouse

Casual attire and above, including appropriate golf attire and uniforms of the day, are permitted. Denim that is free of rips, holes, or tears is permitted. Knitted or banded collars must be at least 1" wide.

A la Carte facilities

Pub, Pub Patio, Lounge '65, Grill Room, Pen's Pavillion

Casual attire and above, including appropriate sports attire and uniforms of the day, are permitted. Denim that is free of rips, holes, or tears is permitted. Colored Shirt for men Knitted or banded collars must be at least 1" wide. Please remove hats in dining areas.

Golf Course, Driving Range, & Practice areas

Penn Oaks is a "Spike less" facility. All golfers are expected to dress in a manner that reflects the decorum of current or traditional golf attire when using any of the Club's golf facilities. Clothing items such as athletic or tennis attire are not appropriate golf attire. Caps should be worn face forward whenever it is appropriate to wear a hat. No Denim of any kind is permitted on the golf course of practice facilities.

For gentlemen, collared shirts should be tucked in. Knitted or banded collars must be at least 1" wide. For ladies, it is not required that shirts be tucked in, but bare mid-riffs should not be visible before, during, or after a swing. Junior golfers are expected to observe the same dress code policy as adults.
